

# PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT (PPE) & GEAR

# 4 WILDLAND GEAR

Lightweight personal protective equipment (PPE) intended for use during extreme conditions in forests and other natural spaces.





# 5 PARTICULATE HOOD

Worn under firefighters' helmets to protect against carcinogens and other harmful toxins.

# 6 SELF-CONTAINED BREATHING APPARATUS (SCBA)

\$6,000

Provides firefighters with breathable air, allowing them to safely explore smoke-filled areas during fires, chemical explosions and other dangerous situations.

# 7 VEHICLE EXTRICATION TOOLS



### **SPREADER**

\$12,500

Hydraulic tool that removes obstructions to allow safe extrication of victims in car accidents and structural collapses.

## **CUTTER**

\$12,000

Hydraulic cutter designed to cut through metal in an effort to extricate victims in need of assistance.



#### **RAM** \$10,000

Hydraulic ram dislodges wreckage to allow safe extrication of entrapped victims in emergency situations.

# VIDEO LARYNGOSCOPE

Provides an efficient line of sight during intubation, allowing first responders to see inside the throat with a camera and monitor.

# 9 AUTOMATED CHEST **COMPRESSION SYSTEM**

\$15,000

Medical device used by first responders to deliver uninterrupted, contactless chest compressions to cardiac patients at a constant rate and depth. This equipment improves survival rates and reduces fatigue for responders. These devices also help reduce transmission of infectious diseases by minimizing contact with patients.





# 10 AUTOMATED EXTERNAL **DEFIBRILLATOR (AED)**

\$1,500

Portable, battery-operated device that allows first responders, schools and the public to be prepared to give lifesaving assistance on-scene if someone goes into cardiac arrest.



#### 11 MONITOR/DEFIBRILLATOR \$32,000

Allows first responders and healthcare professionals to view a patient's heartbeat in real time and treat cardiac arrest emergencies when advanced life support is needed.





12 K9

Highly trained dog that assists first responders during search and rescue missions and detection of drugs, firearms and explosives.











K9s are invaluable to first responders in the event of an emergency. During search and rescue missions like the condo collapse in Surfside, Florida earlier this year, K9s aided efforts by accessing areas of the rubble where rescuers could not and helping provide closure for many of the families impacted.

# 13 RAPID RESPONSE BICYCLE

\$1,200

Provides quick access to emergencies inaccessible by traditional police and rescue vehicles.





14 | RADIO | \$2,500 - \$3,000

Provides reliable two-way communication between dispatchers and first responders to ensure safety on the scene of emergencies.



# 15 TOURNIQUET



Compression device used to minimize blood loss during an emergency before EMS arrive to treat a patient.

# 16 | FIRST AID KIT | \$50-\$150

Contains essential lifesaving supplies, giving first responders the ability to treat wounded individuals during an emergency.







# 17 RESCUE BOAT

\$15,000 - \$35,000

Allows for rapid response to water rescue incidents and helps first responders provide lifesaving assistance in the event of a flood or water emergency.



## 18 THERMAL IMAGING CAMERA

\$5,000 - \$10,000

Allows first responders to see through smoke, darkness and heat-permeable barriers to help locate the source of a fire or victims in need of rescue.

# 19 ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLE AND SKID UNIT

\$15,000 - \$45,000

A maneuverable vehicle allowing for rapid response to off-road incidents and natural disasters, as well as easier access at large events. The skid unit holds rescue equipment for firefighting operations and patient transport.
