DONATION DESCRIPTION

City of McAllen received a fire extinguisher training system worth \$19,100. The awarded training system will allow city officials to train the community on the safe and proper use of fire extinguishers through hands-on instruction and demonstrations. According to the National Association of Fire Equipment Distributors, fire extinguishers have been effective in putting out fires 95 percent of the time and trained individuals are also 250 percent more effective in extinguishing fires.

Mission Fire Department received bicycles and EMS bike bags worth \$13,995. The awarded equipment will allow the department to expand and modernize their bicycle medical team, who maneuver through large crowds and off-road trails to provide life-saving assistance in emergencies.
