FIREHOUSE SUBS PUBLIC SAFETY FOUNDATION AIDS KANSAS FIRST RESPONDERS

More than \$126,000 in equipment grants awarded

WICHITA, Kan. – March 19, 2019 – Continuing its mission of impacting the lifesaving capabilities and the lives of local heroes and their communities, the Firehouse Subs Public Safety Foundation will celebrate \$126,749 worth of lifesaving equipment grants awarded to south-central Kansas first responders on **Tuesday, March 19, 2019 at 2:30 p.m.** The event will take place at the Firehouse Subs restaurant located at 2413 N. Greenwich Road.

"Giving back to our first responders is the primary goal of the Foundation," said Firehouse Subs Public Safety Foundation Senior Manager of Foundation Development Meghan Vargas. "We're in a very fortunate position that allows us to work together with Firehouse Subs restaurants to raise funds that help provide lifesaving equipment locally and throughout the country. Thanks to the generosity of so many people, we're able to make a difference."

The below encapsulates the grant awards being celebrated at the March 19 event, including a brief description of equipment use and value:

- Burrton Consolidated Fire District #5 received an all-terrain vehicle (ATV) and
 accessories valued at \$17,984. The awarded ATV will enhance response efforts in
 areas impassable by traditional emergency vehicles, allowing firefighters to quickly
 reach the scene of emergencies and provide medical and firefighting assistance.
- City of Russell Fire Department received four self-contained breathing
 apparatuses (SCBAs) and cylinders valued at \$27,912. The awarded devices will
 replace older air packs and will be worn when air quality is poor, providing

firefighters necessary protection and breathable air so they can deliver efficient services to the community.

- Clearwater Emergency Services 48 received an inflatable rescue boat, transport trailer and accessories valued at \$21,070. Hutchinson Fire
 Department also received an inflatable rescue boat and accessories valued at \$8,771. The awarded boats will be used in swift water rescue missions during flood emergencies, allowing first responders to reach victims safely.
- Reno County EMS at Hutchinson Regional Medical Center received 44 sets of
 extrication protective gear valued at \$23,079. A recently adapted requirement
 states that all Reno EMS personnel be properly protected during extrication
 situations, and the awarded gear will ensure they're complaint without being
 denied access to patients.
- **Sumner County Fire District 8** received seven structural helmets with built-in lighting and an intake valve valued at \$3,590. The awarded helmets will provide necessary protection and lighting at night or after natural disasters when power is lost. The awarded intake valve will replace outdated equipment still in use, enhancing water flow and slowing the rate of corrosion.
- Valley Center Fire Department received extrication equipment valued at \$24,343. The awarded equipment will improve the department's rescue capabilities for victims in motor vehicle accidents by allowing firefighters to cut through materials used in modern manufacturing and quickly reach victims in need of medical attention.

The events will feature live demonstrations from local first responders explaining the importance of the awarded equipment and how it will be used to save lives. Residents and Firehouse Subs guests are invited to join the celebration and see firsthand how their generous contributions have come full circle to provide much needed equipment in their community. Event attendees include local first responders, Meghan Vargas, Firehouse Subs Area Representative Jim Costello and multiple Firehouse Subs franchisees.

Grant allocations are made possible thanks to the overwhelming support of Firehouse Subs restaurants and generous donors. Each restaurant recycles five-gallon pickle buckets, available to guests for a \$2 donation to the Foundation. Donation canisters on register counters collect spare change, while the Round Up Program

allows guests to "round up" their bill to the nearest dollar. The Foundation is also the beneficiary of a Charitable Sales Promotion where Firehouse of America (FOA) will donate a sum equivalent to 0.11% of all gross sales with a minimum donation of \$1MM through December 31, 2019.
