EQUIPMENT DONATIONS IMPACT MILLIONS OF FAMILIES AND INDIVIDUALS IN COMMUNITIES THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. THE FIREHOUSE SUBS PUBLIC SAFETY FOUNDATION'S REACH CONTINUES TO GROW. IN 2018, 534 PUBLIC SAFETY ORGANIZATIONS WERE AWARDED IN 44 STATES AND PUERTO RICO. MANY PUBLIC SAFETY ENTITIES NOW HAVE THE CRITICAL LIFE-SAVING EQUIPMENT NEEDED TO RESPOND TO EMERGENCY SITUATIONS.
